A Voice Afforded to Crime Victims: Stagger Folds *(Updated 2003)*

The 16-page brochure explains victims' rights within the criminal justice process beginning with the role of law enforcement, and continuing through possible remedies under the new law. There is a special section for child victims.

Accessible Justice: Preparing Sexual Assault Victims with Developmental Disabilities for the Criminal Court Process *(2005)*

This booklet explains the criminal court process and ways advocates can increase accessibility for victims/survivors with developmental disabilities. It includes information on navigating the system and overcoming a variety of barriers to accessibility in the hopes of achieving justice for all victims. Specific opportunities for advocate involvement are highlighted throughout the text.

Creating a Balance: Promoting Healthy Relationships and Preventing Sexual Assault of People with Cognitive Disabilities *(2003)*

This booklet addresses:

- Ways to promote healthy relationships for people with cognitive disabilities
- Environmental factors leading to abuse

Best Practices in Sexual Violence Prevention Education: Recommendations for Prevention Educators Working with Youth in Grades K-12 *(2005)*

This spiral bound manual is 30 pages plus 3 appendices that provide Child Development References, a Prevention Resources Chart and a list of Resource Agencies. Its purpose is to give prevention educators the tools necessary to deliver effective and consistent prevention programming.

Divided into 3 sections (Participants Manual, Model Protocols and Appendices), this manual is designed to help a multidisciplinary audience understand the dynamics of sexual assault and domestic violence against older individuals in order to best serve victims. The model protocol supplement identifies best practices for Law Enforcement officers that are investigating violence against older adults.

POSTERS

“No is Never Wrong. It’s Your Right.” Campaign Posters:

▪ **Boys’ Version**

This 16” x 19” poster is outlined like a mug shot. Within this outline, the text is printed on reflective material that is “mirror-like”. In the top center of the poster, the text reads: *If she says no, and you make her, you’re looking at a mug shot.* The text in the bottom right corner provides additional statistical information.

▪ **Girls’ Version**

This 16” x 19” poster is printed on reflective material that is “mirror-like”. Text in the top center of the poster reads: *If you are a high school girl, you’re looking at the number one target of rape.* The bottom center text provides additional statistical information.

“Real Men Respect” Campaign Posters

▪ **Male Version (*Also available in Spanish*)**

This 11” x 17” poster depicts a teenage male football player in a locker room. The central message of the poster is “Real Men Don’t Force: No matter what she is wearing, what you think of her, or if she changed her mind...forcing sex is never the right move. Real Men Respect.”

▪ **Female Version**

This 11” x 17” poster depicts a resolute teenage female facing the camera directly. The central message of the poster is in response to her question: “What is Hot?”. “When he respects my rights to say stop – no matter what I’m wearing, what he paid for, or where we are – that’s hot. Real Men Respect.”

“Real Men Respect” Campaign Media Packet and CD (Radio Spots)

This packet of information goes along with the “Real Men Respect” Campaign Posters (listed above). It includes 1) handouts that can be duplicated for special events/trainings/classroom presentations, 2) templates so your agency can recreate and personalize material to send out to local media, 3) education and promotion ideas to use in your community and 4) media resources. This comes with a CD of 3 radio spots (one of them available in English and Spanish).
